The Causes of Part Two of the French Revolution are the same causes from Part One, plus one. By 1800, revolution wasn't doing what everyone hoped it would do. There'd been years of the Terror, bloodshed, constant political change, inflation was out of control—pretty much everything was in chaos. *When people feel oppressed or mistreated, they want more freedom. When things are chaotic and dangerous and out-of-control, people don't want more freedom – they want MORE SECURITY.* The Directory and their choice of military leadership is going to provide that sense of security—at least for a while.
